People who move abroad from Switzerland must register with the relevant representation within 90 days after deregistering in Switzerland. You must provide proof that you have deregistered at your last commune of domicile in Switzerland. Anyone who has acquired Swiss citizenship by descent, (re)naturalisation or adoption and is already domiciled in the consular district is also entered in the Register of the Swiss Abroad. Inclusion in the register provides Swiss nationals living abroad with guidance on official acts, for example regarding the issuing of passports, civil status and consular protection. Personal data is handled by the representation in accordance with Art. 11 and 12 of the Swiss Abroad Act and in accordance with Art. 4 of the Federal Act of 24.03.2000 on Personal Data Processing in the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA).

By providing my email address I declare myself until further notice in agreement that the Swiss representation and the FDFA may use it for official communications to the Swiss community abroad (incl. newsletters from the representations). My email address will not be shared with third parties. I undertake to inform my representation of any changes to my email address.

## Documents to be submitted in original or good quality copies:

- valid travel document (Swiss passport or ID card and/or foreign identity document)
- certificate of deregistration from the last commune of domicile in Switzerland (Art. 4 of the Swiss Abroad Ordinance)
- certificate of origin, civil status or family record document (if available / Compulsory for Swiss nationals without a valid Swiss travel document)
