Immerse yourself in precious manuscripts from the **Abbey of St Gall, Switzerland** — some returning to Ireland for the first time in 1000 years — alongside spectacular objects from the Irish world from which they emerged.

To celebrate the loan of these amazing manuscripts, more than 100 remarkable objects from the collection of the National Museum have been gathered for display. Many are recent discoveries, on display for the first time, including the unique Lough Kinale Book-Shrine, which is unveiled following a major conservation project. Through these objects, the story of journeys to and from Europe is told, and our connectedness is celebrated.

Unravel the early medieval journeys of Columbanus, Gall and the monks who travelled to the Alps and beyond, and discover what inspired them through objects and manuscripts.
