

Checklist: Student visa > 90 jours - visa D

Important: applicants have to submit their documents in person

Applications for a long-stay visa are submitted to Switzerland for authorisation. The processing time is between 8 and 12 weeks. Therefore, applications have to be presented on time, in original together with 2 photocopies.

1	3 visa application forms for a long stay visa (visa D), duly completed, dated and signed			
	The form is free of charge. You can ask for it at the counter or you can find it online.			
2	Passport			
	Signed by the applicant. Must be valid for at least three months beyond the planned stay and have at least 2 blank visa pages.			
3	Three recent identical passport photos of excellent quality			
	Background must be white. They are not returned.			
4	Confirmation of enrolment from a school/university in Switzerland with confirmation of payment of registration fees			
5	Curriculum Vitae			
6	Diplomas attesting previous studies			
7	Motivation letter, explaining the reasons for choosing Switzerland as well as your plans after your studies including a commitment to leave Switzerland after your studies			
8	Indication of the full residence address in Switzerland			
9	Proof of sufficient financial means of yourself, your parents or your host to cover the expenses in Switzerland			
	 Last 3 months pay slips Copy of work contract Original bank statements of the last 6 months Title deeds or copy of lease agreements 			
10	For foreigners: copy of the residence permit in the country of residence valid for at least three months beyond the planned stay in Switzerland			
11	Documents confirming the family situation of the applicant			
	For example: marriage certificate, family certificate, birth certificate if single, etc.			
12	Minors			
	• Letter of consent signed by both parents or by the legal guardian with a copy of their passports			

• copy of birth certificate or formal guardianship declaration in case the minor is not under the care of the biological parents

• application forms have to be signed by both parents or legal guardian

The Swiss authorities may request further documentation or other guarantees.
