Work Visa Stay of more than 90 Days (National type D visa)

If you intend to work in Switzerland for more than 90 days, your future employer in Switzerland must file the application for a work permit at the responsible cantonal Office of Migration in Switzerland.

The Regional Consular Center Benelux in The Hague will only be able to issue your visa upon receipt of the authorization for a work permit at the responsible cantonal Office of Migration in Switzerland.

General application rules:

- The applicant has to appear in person with the below mentioned documents.
- An appointment has to be arranged in advance. The visa can normally be picked up the same day.
- The <u>visa administration fees</u> must be paid in cash or by maestro debit card (PIN). If you are married to an EU/EFTA citizen, you must provide a proof of your marriage from your spouse's country of origin to receive the visa free of charge.

3.	Recent passport-size photos in color with white background (not older than 6 months)	1x	
4.	Valid residence permit from NL, BE or LUX, if applicable	1x original 1x copy	
5.	Authorization issued by the cantonal authority (original or copy) in Switzerland	1x	

Please note that this is not an exhaustive list. If necessary, you may be requested to submit additional documents

Within the first 14 days of your initial entry you will have to declare your arrival at the Residents' Registration Office (German: Migrationsamt/Einwohnerkontrolle; French: Police des étrangers/contrôle des habitants; Italian: Ufficio degli stranieri/Controllo degli abitanti) at your place of residence. The residence permit will be issued upon notification of your arrival in Switzerland.
