

# Birth of a child in Zimbabwe to <u>parents married to each other</u>: entry in the Swiss civil status register

Original birth certificate* of the child (Certified Copy of an Entry of Birth Registered in the
district of in Zimbabwe"), issued by the Registrar General of Births and Deaths, legalized by
the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Zimbabwe (see page 2)
Photocopy of Zimbabwean Passport of the child, if available
Photocopy of Swiss Passport or ID Card of the Swiss parent
Photocopy of Passport or ID Card of the Zimbabwean African parent
Questionnaire birth, completed and signed by both parents

The original certificates are submitted to the competent civil status authority in Switzerland and will not be returned **(photocopies or certified copies are not accepted)**. Additional documents may be required by the Swiss civil status authority.

All documents marked with a \* must not be older than six months (date of issue) at the time of their submission to the Regional Consular Centre (RCC).

## Translation

Documents that are not in English must be translated into a Swiss national language (German, French, Italian or Romansch).

#### **Fees**

Entry of the birth in the Swiss civil status register is free of charge, however in certain cases fees can occur. If this is the case, you will be informed accordingly.

## Processing time

Once the complete documentation has been received by the competent Swiss representation, experience has shown that this process can take several weeks or months.

#### Further information

If the documents are sent by mail: Please include a cover letter mentioning your personal and contact details. It is however strongly recommended to use a private courier company.

Only once the birth of the child has been registered in Switzerland and the nationality of the child has been confirmed, parents can apply for a Swiss passport for their child.

Please contact the Regional Consular Centre Southern Africa (RCC) at the Embassy of Switzerland in Pretoria if the **birth took place outside of Zimbabwe**.
