Instruction sheet on exchanging recalled banknotes

The Swiss National Bank recalled its eighth-series banknotes as of 30 April 2021.

While the banknotes from the eighth series have lost their status as legal tender, following the amendment to art. 9, para. 3 of the Federal Act on Currency and Payment Instruments (CPIA) which came into force on 1 January 2020, they can be exchanged at the SNB for an unlimited period at their full nominal value.

Banknotes from the eighth series still held by the general public or other economic agents, as well as banknotes accepted by the latter, can thus be exchanged at any time and for an unlimited period at the SNB cashier's offices in Berne and Zurich at their full nominal value. In addition, several cantonal banks operate agencies on the SNB's behalf (cf. list below). Banknotes can be exchanged at these agencies as well. It is important to note that some agencies apply exchange limits.

Many places also accept banknotes from the eighth series for payments into one's own bank or post office account. Financial institutions must exercise the duty of due diligence in connection with combating money laundering and terrorism financing. The eighth series consists of the following banknotes:



The sixth-series banknotes were recalled as of 1 May 2000 and are also no longer legal tender. They can likewise be exchanged at the SNB for an unlimited period at full nominal value.

The sixth series consists of the following banknotes:



Banknotes from earlier series (the first to third series inclusive, and the fifth series) have already been recalled and can no longer be exchanged at the SNB. The seventh banknote series was a reserve series which was never issued.

Exchange at one of our counters

Banknotes which have been recalled but are still exchangeable can be exchanged in Switzerland at the SNB in Berne or Zurich or at an SNB agency.
