WE ARE BIG IN MICROFINANCE

Switzerland manages the largest share of microfinance assets worldwide and one third of global transboundary microfinance assets.



2001

BlueOrchard is the first fund manager specialising in microfinance worldwide. Founded in 2001 thanks to the joint effort of UN agencies and private bankers in Geneva.



2003



Launch of the responsAbility Global Microfinance Fund, an asset manager focusing on development investments and one of the first microfinance funds open to retail investors. Originally it was a public-private partnership with SECO and the SDC.



BLENDED

The Swiss Capacity Building Facility is a public-private development partnership to assist financial institutions scaling up their outreach to poor people in developing countries.

2016

Symbiotics, UBS and SECO went a step further than microfinance with the launch of a fund providing loans to “the missing middle” offering the capital required for SME business growth in developing countries.

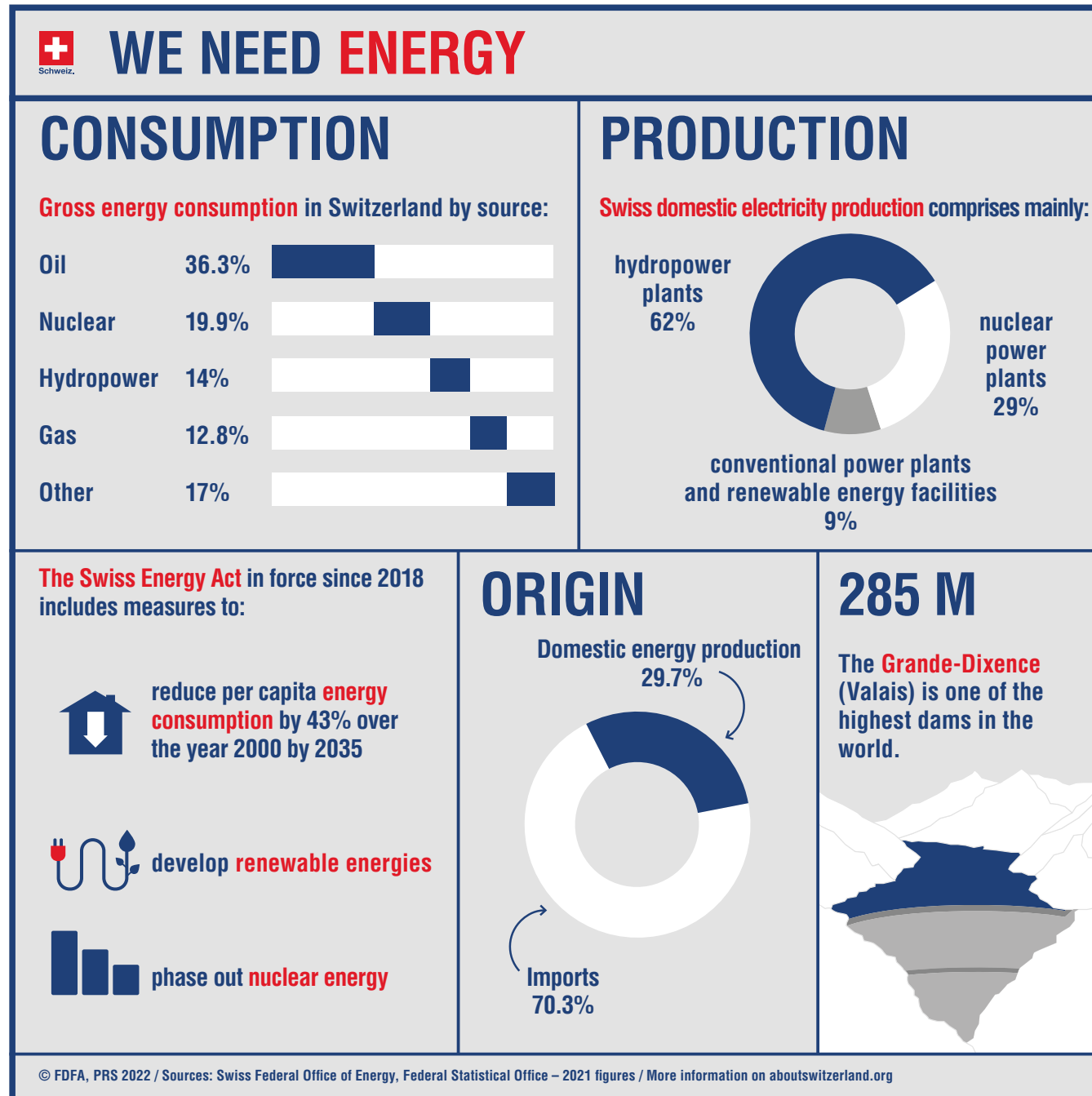

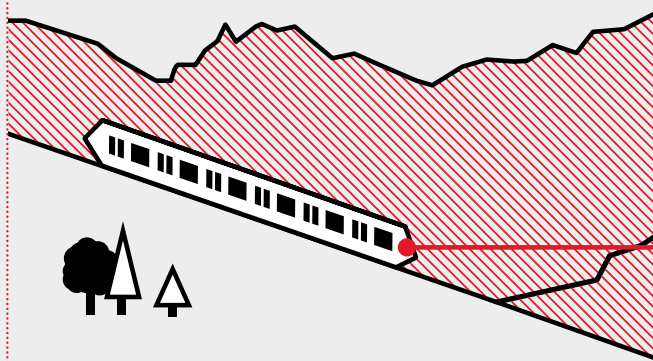

In no other country in the world is rail travel more popular than in Switzerland, with each inhabitant covering an average of 2,400 km per year.



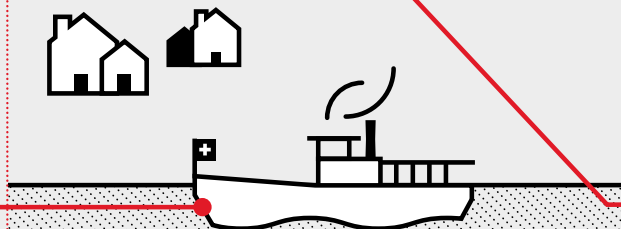
The Swiss transport network includes 1,384 km of mountain railways.



In 2018 almost 6.1 million motor vehicles were registered in Switzerland, including 4.6 million cars.



Around 170 passenger ships carry around 13 million passengers per year on Swiss lakes and rivers.



The Mobility car sharing cooperative is going from strength to strength. In 2018 it had 197,800 members, with 3,090 vehicles at 1,480 locations across the country.

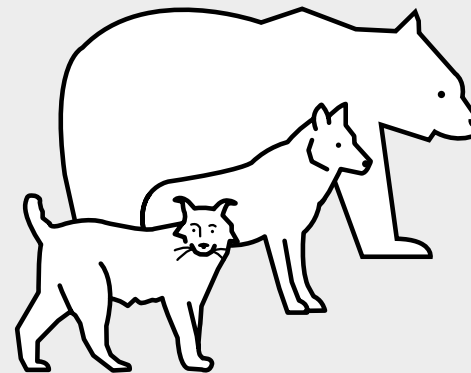
HORNS

The Swiss mountains are home more than 90,000 chamois and about 17,000 ibex.

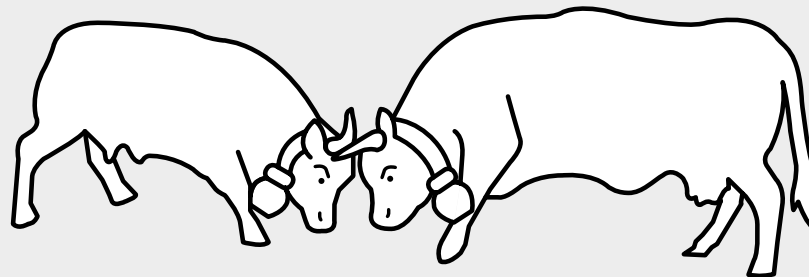
CATS + DOGS

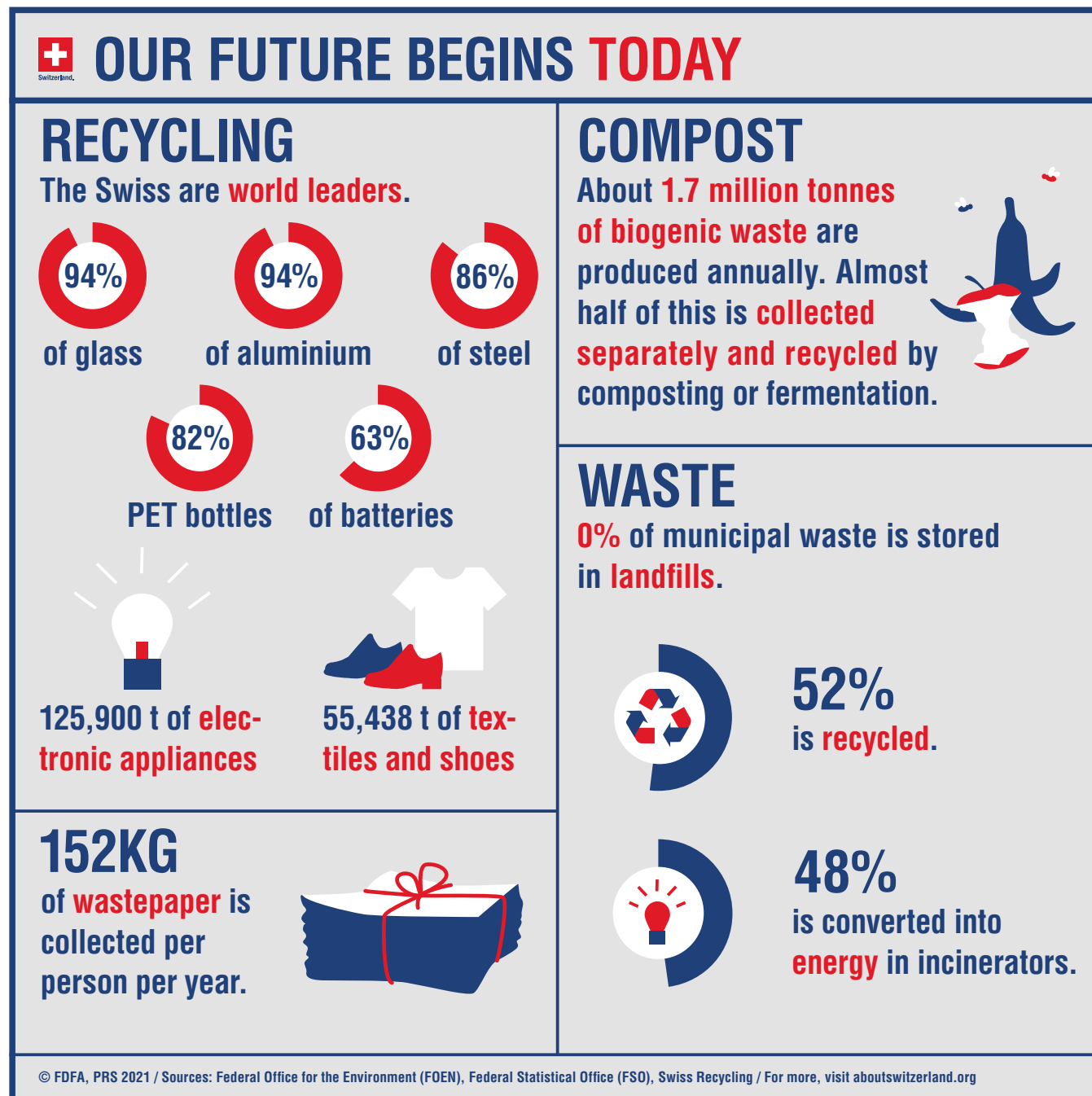

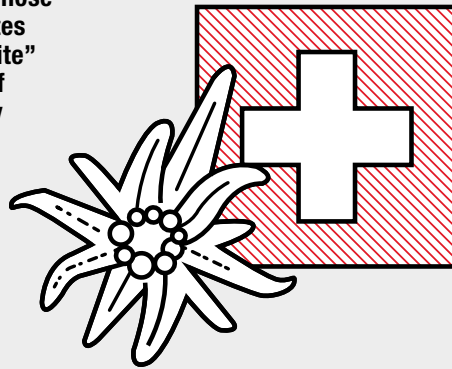

EDELWEISS

This flower, whose name translates as “noble-white” is a symbol of Swiss identity



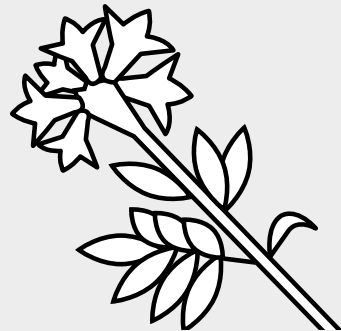
GENTIAN

The blue gentian is one of the most popular Swiss alpine flowers. Schnapps is distilled from the roots of the yellow gentian.



ALPINE ROSE

The bright red flowers of the alpine rose can be seen from a great distance, especially above the tree line.



WHITE NARCISSI

Their blooms are known as “May snow” because they appear in such quantities that they carpet whole meadows above Montreux.

POWER-SHARING

The members of the Federal Council usually belong to the political parties with the biggest electoral base and come from different linguistic regions.



1984 was the first year in which a woman held a seat in the Federal Council. In 2010 there were more women than men in the Federal Council for the first time.

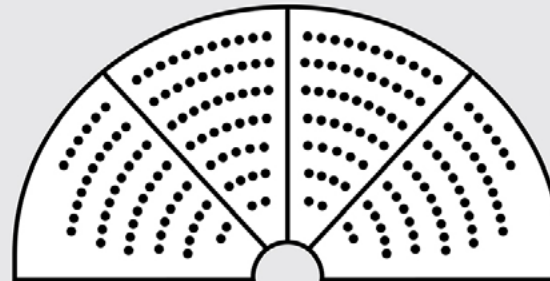


PRIMUS INTER PARES

The President of the Swiss Confederation is elected for one year only and performs special ceremonial duties.



Switzerland's government (Federal Council) is a collegial body with seven members elected for a four-year term by Parliament. The Federal Chancellor acts as Chief of Staff of the Federal Council.



Each member of the Federal Council heads one of the seven departments of the Federal Administration.

The Federal Council is a collegial body in which the members share equal power.

A WELL-BALANCED MECHANISM

Every canton has its own constitution, parliament, government and courts. About a fifth of communes have their own parliament, in particular the cities.



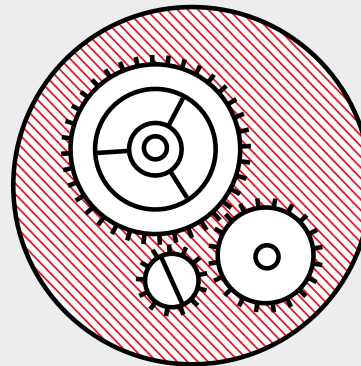
$$1+26+2,000=1$$

Power is shared by the federal government, the 26 cantons and around 2,000 communes.

Federalism is what allows the different aspects of Switzerland, with its four national languages and large geographical differences, to coexist. Federalism was one of the founding principles of the Swiss Confederation in 1848.

SUBSIDIARITY

The cantons and communes have authority over a wide range of matters (e.g. schools, hospitals, tax and policing) and a great deal of autonomy. The federal government only takes on tasks that the cantons and communes cannot manage alone.

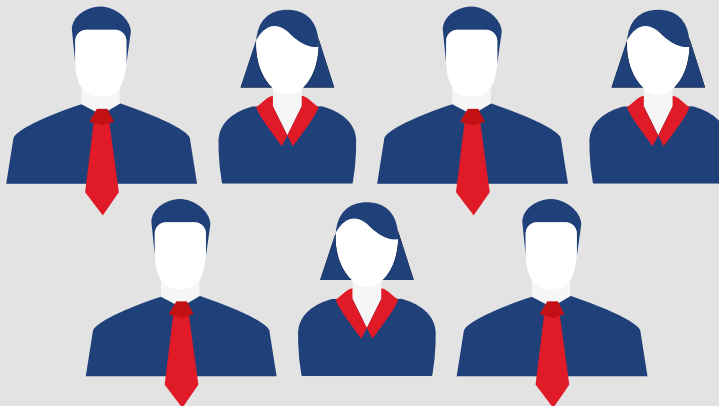

ONE FOR ALL, ALL FOR ONE

One of a kind: Switzerland doesn't have just one head of state, but seven!



The government, known as the **Federal Council**, is made up of **seven members** elected by Parliament. All decisions are made **collectively**. Each member also heads a department of the federal government.

DUTIES

The President of the Confederation:

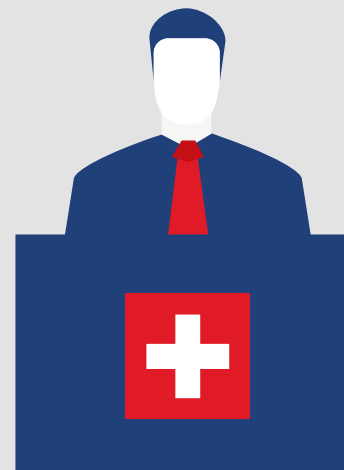
- Chairs **Federal Council meetings**
- Represents Switzerland **abroad**
- Represents Switzerland at **events at home**
- Continues running his or her **own department**

FIRST AMONG EQUALS

The President of the Confederation is elected by Parliament for a term of **one year**. During this time, he or she remains formally equal to the other federal councillors. The role of **president** is assumed by each federal councillor on a **rotational basis**, according to the principle of seniority.

2023

Alain Berset, head of the Federal Department of Home Affairs, will assume the office of **president in 2023**.

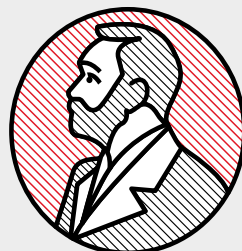
GENEVA

The Swiss citizen Henry Dunant first came up with the idea of creating an international convention to protect victims of war.

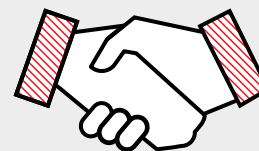

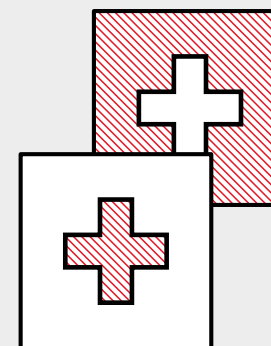

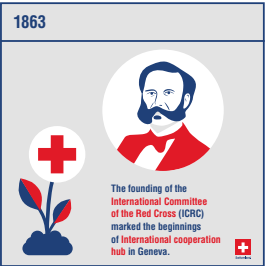

 saves lives and enables sustainable development



Switzerland remains strongly engaged in mine action.

In 2020–2021, Switzerland served as President of the 2nd Review Conference of the Convention on Cluster Munitions. The efforts resulted in the adoption of the measurable and ambitious 2021–2026 Lausanne Action Plan.



Switzerland remains strongly engaged in mine action.

In 2021, Switzerland supported mine action projects in **11 countries**.




It deployed **14 experts** in **7 different contexts**.

Clearance activities reduce human suffering, allow access to land and enable economic activities.

As part of Switzerland's activities:

12'900 devices were found and destroyed;

More than **20 km²** of land were cleared and handed back to the local communities.




Switzerland is committed to the **full participation of mine victims in their societies.**

5'700

In 2021, Switzerland assisted more than 5'700 victims with medical support or by promoting income-generating activities.

Mine risk education prevents new accidents, saving lives and protecting the civilian population.

In 2021, thanks to Switzerland's activities, more than **56'000** people learnt how to adopt safe behaviour.

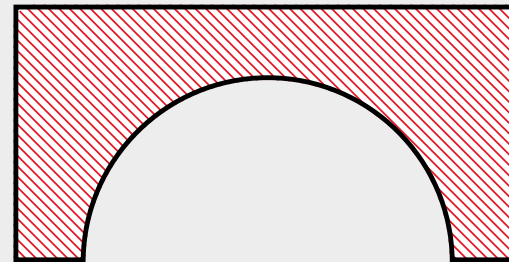
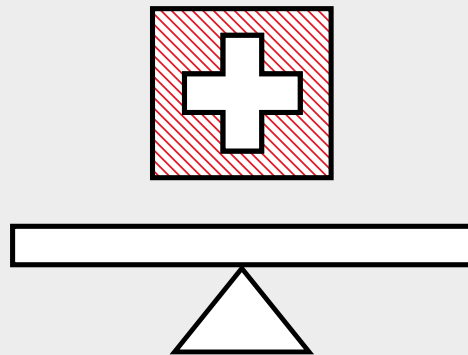

NEUTRAL

As a neutral country, Switzerland does not take part in armed conflicts or military alliances. This neutrality is an important pillar of Swiss foreign policy.



Switzerland acts as a protective power for third countries that have broken off relations with another country. Switzerland currently fulfils 7 diplomatic and/or consular mandates of this type.

Switzerland is a member of seven international organisations. EFTA, Council of Europe, OSCE, OECD, World Bank, International Monetary Fund, UN.

HUMANITARIAN TRADITION

as host country to the International Committee of the Red Cross and depositary state of the Geneva Conventions of 1949:

- Emergency and reconstruction assistance in the event of natural disasters and armed conflicts
- Development assistance in countries and regions in need
- Supporting countries in their transition to democracy and the market economy
- Asylum for victims of political persecution

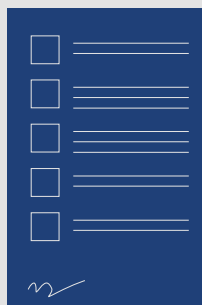


WHAT IS SWISS NEUTRALITY?



Neutrality is a successful **instrument** of Swiss **foreign and security policy**. It is based on the **law of neutrality** and **neutrality policy** as well as on Switzerland's **history and traditions**.

A LEGAL FRAMEWORK



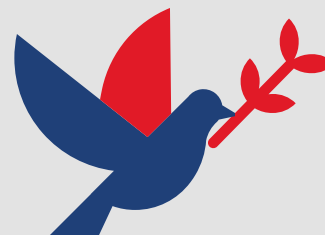
Switzerland's **permanent neutrality** is anchored in **international law**. The **law of neutrality** sets out the **rights and obligations** of neutral states. It is enshrined in the **Hague Conventions of 1907** and is part of **customary international law**.

A POLICY

The **policy of neutrality** aims to uphold Switzerland's **credibility and independence** as a neutral state, in accordance with specific circumstances. Switzerland plays a special role **internationally** by **mediating** and **building bridges**.

A HUMANITARIAN TRADITION

Based on its long-standing tradition of **good offices** and **humanitarian aid**, Switzerland accords its neutrality a **peace-related** and **humanitarian** orientation.



AN IDENTITY

Neutrality is an integral part of the **identity of Switzerland and its citizens**. It does not impede Switzerland from freely expressing political opinions and working for the **respect** and **defence** of its **fundamental values** such as **democracy**, **the rule of law** and **human rights**.

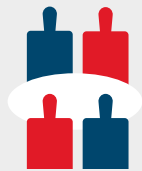

Water as an Instrument for peace

Blue Peace initiative refers to **water cooperation** across borders, sectors and generations to **foster peace, stability and sustainable development**.

Sharing water is vital

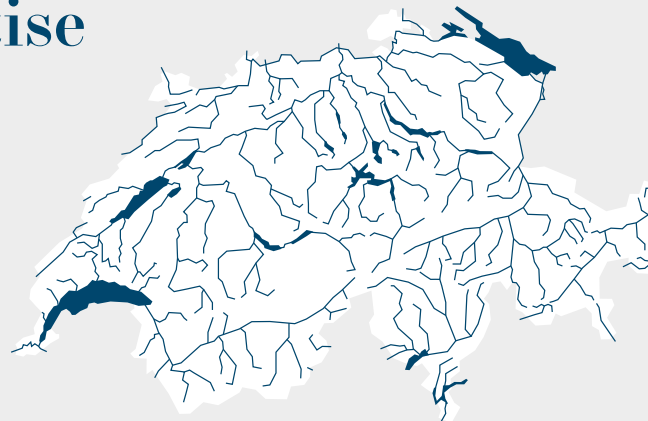
- **153 countries** worldwide **share transboundary basins** (rivers, lakes, aquifers)
- Over **2 billion people** depend on **shared water resources**
- 2/3 of the world's transboundary basins **lack arrangements** for water cooperation



Switzerland's expertise

Through **Blue Peace initiative**, Switzerland:

- supports both cross-border cooperation and national platforms **for dialogue on water management**.
- shares its **long experience in transboundary water management**: 6 rivers and 4 lakes shared with its neighbors.

A Swiss tradition & an international obligation

What is International Humanitarian Law?
A set of rules binding for all parties to an armed conflict which seeks to limit the effects of armed conflict, by:



protecting civilians and other persons, who do not or no longer take part in hostilities



regulating the conduct of hostilities and restricting the means and methods of warfare

In case of **violations**, states are required to **prosecute and punish** the responsible individuals, for example for war crimes, or hand them over to an international criminal tribunal.





A SWISS TRADITION

International Humanitarian Law is a cornerstone of Switzerland's foreign policy.

The First **Geneva Convention** of 1864 was drafted at the initiative of the Swiss government. Switzerland is the depositary of the four Geneva Conventions of 1949 and their **Additional Protocols** of 1977 and 2005.

SWITZERLAND'S ENGAGEMENT

Switzerland works to **ensure compliance** with International Humanitarian Law and urges all parties to armed conflicts **to respect its rules and principles**. It supports independent institutions such as the International Committee of the Red Cross or the International Criminal Court. 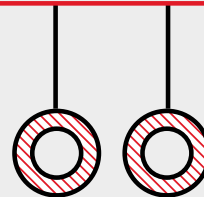
HOSENLUPF
