As a Swiss citizen residing abroad and turning 18, you acquire new rights and obligations. Find the relevant information below.

Registration at your Swiss representation

When you turn 18, you will receive a registration form from your Swiss representation. Sign and return the registration confirmation within 90 days or register online via the FDFA's online desk.

FDFA's online desk

Via the online desk, you can easily apply for a passport, register to vote, or inform your representation of a new email, postal address, or a change in civil status (marriage, birth, etc.).

Education

Switzerland offers a wide range of opportunities for education, vocational training, and employment. Swiss citizens residing abroad do not need a residence or work permit to access them.

Military Service

In times of peace, Swiss citizens living abroad are exempt from conscription and military service as long as they reside abroad. Swiss citizens living abroad who settle permanently in Switzerland are required to perform military service depending on their age.

Political Rights

To exercise your right to vote you will need to register with your representation through the FDFA online desk. You can also register by post or by visiting your representation in person.

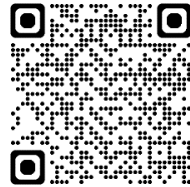

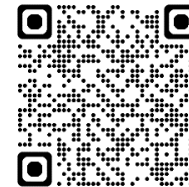
